Biennial Budget Permits Home-School and Private School Students to Play on Athletic Teams in their District of Residency - Home-schooled and private school students in Ohio now have the right to play on sports teams and participate in other extracurricular activities thanks to a provision in Biennial Budget HB 59. Athletic and other extracurricular associations have their own rules about student participation in competitive or inter-scholastic activities. These provisions in the state budget override those rules.

Under the new provisions, public schools must allow private school students to participate in an extracurricular activity only if their private schools do not offer the same activity.

Home-schooled and private school students must meet the same age and grade requirements as district students and pay the same Pay To Participate Activity Fee.

HB 59 Changes Minimum School Year - Beginning with school year 2014-2015 the law changes the minimum school year for school districts from 182 days to 910 hours for all-day kindergarten and grades 1 to 6; and 1,001 hours for grades 7 to 12.

The law maintains the five-day school week, but specifies that nonpublic schools may be open for instruction on any day of the week, including Saturday and Sunday. The law also includes the following provisions:

- · Eliminates excused calamity days for schools generally, as well as the requirement for a contingency plan to make up calamity days.
- · Requires school district boards to hold a public hearing on the school calendar 30 days prior to adopting the school calendar.
- · Requires school districts, prior to changing the hours or days in which a school is open, to consider the compatibility of the proposed change on the scheduling needs of JVSDs.

Hamilton Preparing Grant for HB59 Straight A Fund - HB59 appropriates \$100 million in FY14 and \$150 million in FY15 for a new competitive grant program funded from the Lottery Profits Education Fund. The program provides competitive grants to school districts for projects that aim to achieve significant advancement in one or more of the following goals: student achievement; spending reduction in the five-year fiscal forecast; or utilization of a greater share of resources in the classroom.

The amounts of the grants are capped at \$5 million for individual entities and \$15 million for consortia.

Our district is currently preparing a Straight A Fund Grant proposal that will establish a longitudinal data, assessment and instruction resource. This resource will be developed by the users and will be accessible in real-time to inform decision-making at the student, classroom, teacher, building, or district levels. The goal of the grant will be to improve student growth and success. Dr. Susan Witten has been designated by Superintendent Lester to coordinate the Straight A Fund Grant proposal.

PSAT selected for new college-career readiness assessment - Ohio high school sophomores will take the PSAT assessment beginning in October 2014. This assessment will show if students are on course to graduate ready for college or a career.

The PSAT is administered nationally by The College Board. It will be provided free to students under the provisions of a state law requiring that Ohio establish a college and career assessment program. The assessment will not be used for college admissions, placement or course grades, but rather to help guide high school course selection and preparation.

KRA-L approved by **ODE** for the Third Grade Reading Guarantee for the 2013-2014 school year - The Third Grade Reading Guarantee now requires that students in kindergarten through grade three take a reading diagnostic to determine if the student is reading at grade level. The diagnostics are given at the beginning of each school year. Because of this, ODE should only expect students to have mastery of the previous school year's material. It is the goal of the Ohio Department of Education (ODE) to develop or identify the best possible tools to help diagnose reading deficiencies.

Ohio is currently in the process of revising its early learning and development standards for children which will include end of preschool standards aligned to the common core state standards.

Schools wishing to use the Kindergarten Readiness Assessment – Literacy (KRA-L) must still meet the requirements of the Third Grade Reading Guarantee. This includes administering the assessment by September 30th. Students who receive a KRA-L score that falls in Band 1, which indicates "Assess broadly for intense instruction", should be considered and reported as not on-track. Students scoring above this range will be considered on-track.

More guidance on the KRA-L and the Third Grade Reading Guarantee can be found on ODE's website. These resources will continue to be updated as new information becomes available. Change in State Law Prevents GED Costs from Rising - Good news for adults in the state of Ohio seeking a GED. "According to the Ohio Department of Education (ODE), language in the new state budget guarantees that first-time GED test takers will not have to pay additional money when costs for the new computer-based version triple in 2014. According to the legislation "... up to \$2 million in each fiscal year shall be used to pay career-technical planning districts for the amounts reimbursed to students" taking the computer-based GED test for the first time. The goal of the legislation is to offset any additional application or test fees in excess of the current \$40 cost," Taken from the publication Focus Education, a service of the Hannah News Service.

In 2014, the GED tests will only be available as an on-line test. Ohio has been proactively offering this opportunity in many locations since the fall of 2012. Career counseling and information on adult education programs will be offered as part of the GED testing

process to help move the testers into a successful career.
