**ODE releases A-F report cards** - Yesterday the Ohio Department of Education released new district and school report cards that, for the first time, assign A-F letter grades on nine measures.

These new report cards will make the educational performance of our schools and district more transparent than ever. Our district and school report cards will also position us to have a productive dialogue with your community about strengths and opportunities that can drive the Hamilton Local School District's improvement.

The reports were made available to the public beginning on Thursday, August 22, at reportcard.education.ohio.gov.

The new report cards have nine measures. These nine measures cannot and should not be averaged into a single grade for a school or our district. Beginning in August of 2015, the report card will include additional measures along with component and overall district and building grades.

### OFFICE OF THE ASSISTANT SUPERINTENDENT

**Health and Safety -** Our buildings fully initiated our new safety protocol this week, which uses audio/video monitoring systems in each building entry point. This system allows our staff to review all individuals entering our facilities to confirm their reasons for visiting. This process provides an additional layer of safety for our students and staff. To date, all feedback regarding this system has been positive, with many parents thanking us for providing such safe schools.

All of our buildings are currently being monitored with this system. Over the next few weeks, we will be upgrading our middle school and preschool to feature additional video monitoring.

**Food Services -** Last spring, the district determined that a change in our food service software was needed. The previous software, Lunchbox, worked well, but would no longer support the on-line payment application that our community has grown to use in record numbers. With this in mind, Mr. Morrison and Mrs. Hillerich visited many different school districts to get information regarding the service being used in our area. After many onsite reviews, Mr. Morrison determined that Meals Plus would be the best solution that would also be compatible with our existing online payment plan.

This summer, our head cooks went through a very intensive training with representative from Meals Plus and on Monday, they put their training to the test. While there were a few glitches in the process, by the end of the day and with the help of our technology staff, issues and concerns were addressed and we have been running smoothly. Thanks to Mary Anne Hillerich, Sharron Sewell, Susan Adkins, Judy Quinn, Lori Hunley and Lisa Way for their supreme efforts and thanks to Lisa Buchanan, Verlin Samples and Tom Motika for providing excellent technical support. Also thanks to each building principal for working through slightly longer lunches on Monday to allow the software issues to be addressed and still provide time for our students to enjoy their meal.
