Superintendent's Weekly Wrap-up: Aug. 9-16, 2013

OSBA Student Achievement Fair - OSBA Student Achievement Fair still has openings. Graduation Committee Continues Discussions of End-of-Course Exams - The State Board of Education's Graduation Committee continued its discussions of new end-ofcourse exams and diploma requirements linked to the work of the Partnership for Assessment of Readiness in College and Careers (PARCC), hearing Tuesday from three consultants experienced in Ohio education policy.

Sen. Peggy Lehner (R-Kettering), chairwoman of the Senate Education Committee, asked presenters to address the concern discussed among lawmakers -- the sheer number of tests. ODE staff at the committee's previous meeting described plans for 10 end-of-course exams: three each in math and English language, and two each in science and social studies. Lehner also asked whether the paper-and-pencil versions of the tests being developed would be "inferior" to the regular, computer-based versions.

Sasheen Phillips, executive director for curriculum and assessments at ODE, told the committee that 523 districts or charter schools had completed an assessment with the department's technology readiness tool, and about 240 of them had indicated readiness to meet the technology requirements for administering the test.

James Wright, curriculum and assessments director, said while the tests won't be the same, they are to be written to the same standards and cognitive level.

Phillips noted that under PARCC, schools not ready to administer tests on computers must still document progress toward doing so.

ODE Launches Principal Toolkit on Reading Guarantee, Standards, Other Changes - The Ohio Department of Education has developed a suite of online resources for local building leaders to help them understand and communicate a wave of policy changes going into effect, Superintendent Richard Ross noted in his weekly message to Ohio schools.

This "principal toolkit" addresses upcoming changes related to new A-F report cards for local schools, the Third Grade Reading Guarantee, Common Core standards and teacher evaluations. Included in the toolkit are sample newsletter articles, fact sheets, explanatory graphics and videos addressing those four topics, to be used by principals in communicating with teachers and families.
