# **Ohio's State Tests – Spring 2015 information**

Graduation Frequently Asked Questions updated - In December, Gov. Kasich signed H.B. 367, which included changes in Ohio's graduation requirements. Here is an update of the FAQs on the Ohio Department of Education graduation web page.

Third Grade Reading - Students in grade 3 will take the Ohio Achievement Assessment in reading. They will not take the PARCC English language arts test. Third-grader students will still take the new state test for mathematics (PARCC – Math) in spring of 2015.
