Current HT Varsity Football Head Coach Is One Of School's All-Time Best - HammyHighAlumni.com founder and proud HTHS Alum, Chuck Hughes recently shared some data he gathered showing the career coaching records of HT's head varsity football coaches dating back to 1946, the year they began keeping win-loss records for the sport. What he found was that current head football coach, Nathan Hillerich has more wins as the Rangers' head coach (34) than any other coach since these records have been kept. According to Hughes' data, Coach Hillerich also has the 3rd best winning percentage on the list as well at 67% (34-17 record), but it is by far the best winning percentage over the past 36 years. Coach Paul Orr (1950-1953) won 80% of the games he coached and tallied a 28-7 overall record. Coach Jack Mondell (1975-1978) won 73% of his games and posted a 22-7-1 record as HT's head ball coach.

"In 2014 we had seven of the original 11 coaches that were with me when we started things off in 2010," shared Hillerich. "The past five years have been pretty good, and I expect the next five to be even better!"

Senate Passes Student Testing 'Safe Harbor - The Senate unanimously passed legislation that would grant "safe harbor" to students taking the Partnership for Assessment of Readiness for College and Careers (PARCC) testing this year.

HB7 (Buchy), which prohibits student scores from the PARCC tests being used to hold a child back or to have an effect on their grades, was the only bill on the Senate's agenda, passing with an emergency clause to make it effective with the governor's signature.

Senate Education Chairwoman Peggy Lehner (R-Kettering) said on the floor that most standardized tests don't have an effect on a student's grade, and the bill reassures parents that the PARCC will not have an effect either.

Sen. Randy Gardner (R-Bowling Green) said the bill is just a warm-up to what the Senate plans to do to address concerns about standardized testing, with both

he and Lehner alluding to their later announcement on a testing advisory committee.

After session, Senate President Keith Faber (R-Celina) said they are not sure what the Ohio Department of Education was going to do when it comes to safe harbor for the PARCC tests this year, so they wanted to clarify the law. He said the bipartisan support of the bill recognizes the issues all Ohioans are having with the testing.

voice). Throughout the day I teach four different classes, 2 sections of Statistics, Double Block (Alg II/Pre-calc), AP Calc, and Pre-Calc. I have freshmen in advisory so during that period, between my advisory students and any other students that I may have, I might field questions from Alg I, Geometry, Alg II, Stats, Pre-Calc, or Calculus. It keeps me on my toes. At the end of the day, I revise old files to go along with my lessons for the next day, and write up new assignments for the Stats class that is in its first year of existence. I also work with students that come in seeking extra help both during my planning period and after school. It is a pleasure to work with our students with the support of the administration and all of my colleagues here at HTHS. Thank you." - Cote
