55	100	<p>An “A” in AP Literature and Composition suggests imminent success on the AP exam. As only 10 percent of AP candidates earn a “5” on the exam, it is reasonable to make it equally challenging to earn an “A” in the course. A score of 41-55 on the multiple choice section is a challenging goal, yet some 60 percent of those “5” candidates typically score in that range and 35 percent of the “4” candidates typically score in the 41-55 range.</p>
